The coronavirus pandemic has taken a heavy toll on immigrant New Yorkers, both in terms of its health impact and the economic fallout, and now a new report (<https://maketheroadny.org/excluded-in-the-epicenter-impacts-of-the-covid-crisis-on-working-class-immigrant-black-and-brown-new-yorkers/>) shows just how deep and ubiquitous the damage has been so far.

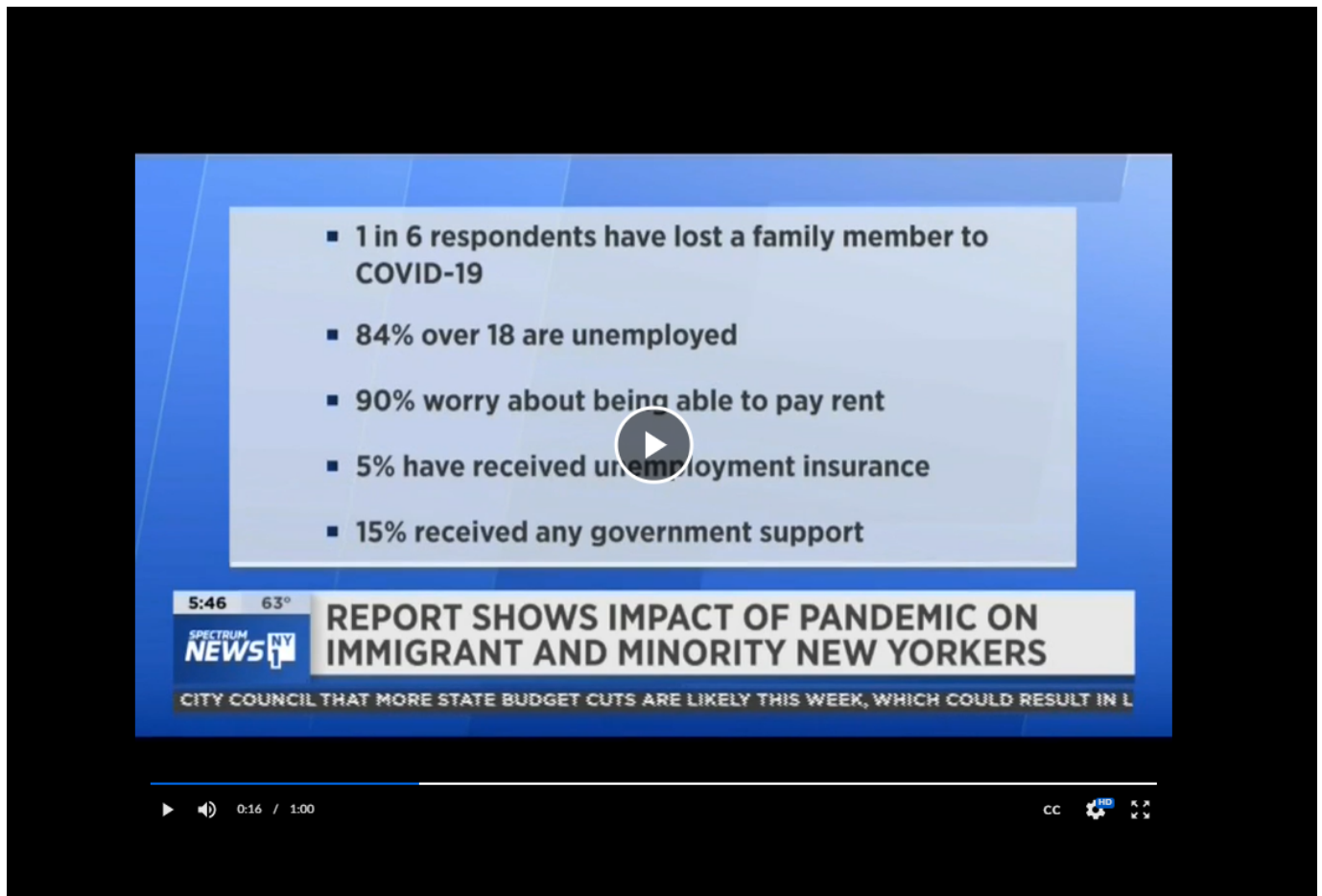
In a detailed survey of 244 New Yorkers in the metropolitan region, one in six families said they have lost a relative (<https://gothamist.com/news/low-income-nyc-residents-undocumented-immigrants-could-get-financial-relief-burying-loved-ones-during-coronavirus-crisis>) to COVID-19 (<https://gothamist.com/news/racial-breakdown-nycs-covid-19-cases-necessary-track-pandemics-inequities>). Black and Hispanic New Yorkers are dying from COVID-19 at about twice the rate of white New Yorkers, according to city data (<https://gothamist.com/news/experts-worry-health-inequalities-highlighted-coronavirus-will-continue-grow>).

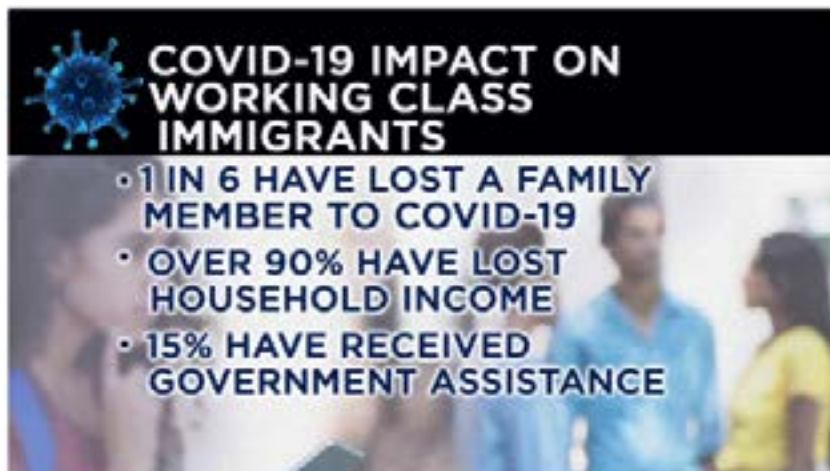

Impact from COVID-19 in working class immigrant neighborhoods catastrophic

NEW YORK — One in six residents of working class immigrant neighborhoods in downstate New York have lost a family member to COVID-19 and 92% report having lost at least one source of income due to the pandemic, a new survey highlighting the struggles of immigrant families found.

This is one of the first studies where data has been compiled directly from some of the most vulnerable residents in the hardest hit communities of the epicenter of the COVID-19 outbreak in the U.S. The survey, "Excluded in the Epicenter," was conducted by advocacy organization Make The Road New York and nonprofit Hester Street in April.

Analysis of MRNY and Hester Street shows that despite being the hardest hit, they are still excluded from government aid

Data from the City Health Department confirmed in early April that **Hispanics were New Yorkers** most hit by the coronavirus crisis, representing 34% of the total deaths. And that devastating impact that COVID-19 has had in this community, as in other minority groups such as blacks, was again demonstrated by a new study that reveals the **extraordinary damages** that the pandemic has had among **immigrants** and the working class.
